The Scholarship Program provides funds for enrollment in undergraduate, graduate or professional studies at approved colleges, universities and private career (or vocational) schools in the State of Maryland.

To be eligible for a Delegate Diana M. Fennell Scholarship, applicants:

- MUST LIVE IN DISTRICT 47-A. Please go to <u>http://mdelect.net/</u> to make sure Delegate Fennell is one of YOUR Delegates. If she is, then please submit this application. If she is not, please contact your district delegates and senator for their specific scholarship applications. The main number to the Maryland General Assembly is 301-858–3000.
- COMPLETE AND FILE THE APPLICATION FOR A DELEGATE SCHOLARSHIP: The application must be completed and filed by the deadline. You must have a 2.0 GPA.
- MUST INCLUDE A 500 WORD ESSAY INDICATING WHAT MAKES YOU MOST QUALIFIED TO RECEIVE THIS SCHOLARSHIP.
- COMPLETE AND FILE THE FAFSA (APPLICATION FOR FINANCIAL AID): This form may be obtained from high school guidance counselors, in high school libraries, or from the Maryland Higher Education Commission, 6 N. Liberty St., Baltimore, MD 21201, Phone 410-767-3300, or http://www.mhec.state.md.us/. The FAFSA should be filed no later than March 1, 2024 to ensure the Scholarship Committee's receipt of the applicant's financial aid information in a timely manner.

PLAN TO ATTEND A MARYLAND COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY, OR PRIVATE CAREER SCHOOL: The applicant must attend a college, university, or private career school in the State of Maryland. The private career school must have the approval of the Maryland Higher Education Commission to operate, and must be accredited by a national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of Education. Applicants may be eligible for scholarship assistance to attend out-of-state colleges, universities or private career schools if they are enrolling in an academic program which is not offered in a Maryland college, university, or private career school.
